## LOCALITY

Southern North Sea

## AIMS

- 1. To collect fish endocrine organs for hormone assay
- 2. To collect live dabs
- 3 To collect dab gonada and brains
- 4 To collect live plaice
- 5 To collect muscle samples from rays
- 6 To collect live glankton

## NARRATIVE

CLIONE sailed from Lowestoft at 1100 h, 26 February and proceeded to the Outer Silver Fit where she trawled until 1700 h, 4 March. Gales prevented fishing on one day. CLIONE docked at Lowestoft at 0640 h, 5 March.

## RUSULIS

- (1) Pituitary and hypothalamus were collected from at least 9.700 plaice and dabs and 320 cod, haddock and whiting. Pincal glands were collected from cod.
- (2) 87 live female dabs were brought back to Lowestoft for use in maturation experiments.
- (3) Dab gonads and brains were fixed for histological examination. Dabs covering the full size range were frozen for subsequent laboratory measurement of body, gonad and liver weights.
- (4) 35 live plaice were brought back to Lowestoft for growth experiments.
- (5) Wings were collected from Raja radiate and Raja batis for examination of muscle structure
- (6) Two live plankton samples were brought back to Lowestoft

- (7) 25 1 Kilogram bags of small whiting were frozen for fish food
- (9) It was noticed that a number of dabs were suffering from sores or lymphocystis, of a sample of 1 30 dabs 56 (3.62) had sores and 23 (1.50) had lymphocytis. A sample of 401 plaice revealed 2 with the sores and 1 with lymphocystis.

Samples of fish with sores and lymphocastis were fixed.
