Objectives

To further disturb the sediment and associated fauna in a precisely defined area along the west shore of Loch Gareloch using a rock-hopper ground gear with no trawl net attached.

To record tow positions using a GPS navigation system.

Out turn days per project: 1 Day BGFZ

Narrative

"Jeannie Stella" sailed from her mooring in Loch Long at 0700 on the morning of 6 April and proceeded to Gourock to allow the embarkation of the Marine Laboratory staff member. She then sailed for Rhu Narrows in Loch Gareloch, arriving there at approximately 0845. On receiving permission from the Queen's Harbourmaster at RN Faslane, "Jeannie Stella" moved onto station on the west side of the loch and commenced operations at 0900. Tows were carried out all day until 1600 when the vessel left Gareloch and made for Gourock, arriving there at 1630.

Results

A total of ten, 45 minute trawls were completed during the day, each tow using a 75 m warp with an approximate vessel speed of two knots.

Mud, evidence of epifaunal organisms and pieces of debris were observed on parts of the trawl gear throughout the day indicating some disturbance effect.

The start, mid and end positions of six selected tows were recorded using the vessel's GPS navigation system (see Table 1 and Figure 1). These data will provide accurate positioning information for future sampling cruises.


