# **OBJECTIVES**

- A.

- 1. To establish the distribution of hake in the North Channel and Nothern Irish Sea in May.
- 2. To examine maturity stage and feeding behaviour of hake in North Channel.
- 3. To investigate distribution and abundance of the ghost shrimp <a href="Pasiphaea sivado">Pasiphaea sivado</a>.

## NARRATIVE

Lough Foyle sailed at 23 00 on Sunday and trawling commenced north of Rathlin Island early Monday morning. A total of 10 tows were completed despite problems with the midwater net which necessitated a return to Belfast on Wednesday. During this time the scanmar trawl door monitors were dismounted to increase the trawl opening width. The ship returned to Belfast 18.00 Friday 26 May.

## Results

A total of 172 Hake were caught using 3 hour tows at 10 stations. The majority of these were found in the area of tows 4 and 5, and many of the larger fish were close to breeding condition. Large numbers of <u>Pasiphaea sivado</u> were found in the North Channel region and this was the most dominant food item in Hake stomachs.
