REPORT

14 November - 8 December 1978

Objectives

To estimate the relative strengths of pre-recruit plaice year classes on various nursery grounds on the east coast of Scotland.

Narrative

Weather conditions delayed the start of the trip until Thursday 16 November. Work commenced in the Dornoch Firth and stations in Nairn Bay, Spey Bay and Burghead Bay were carried out in difficult conditions. On Tuesday 28 November operations were moved to the Firth of Forth and the survey was continued in the Berwick/Haddington area, Tynningham Sands, Iargo Bay and Aberlady Bay. Severe weather with mainly south-easterly gales continued to hamper operations. On Tuesday December 5 passage was made to Aberdeen en route for the Moray Firth.

In the light of the continuing stormy weather conditions and adverse forecasts, after consultation with the Laboratory it was decided to abandon the remainder of the trip. Scientific gear was unloaded on Thursday 7 December in Aberdeen.

Results

Fishing was extremely poor; very few flatfish were encountered in any of the areas. The numbers of plaice and dabs caught in each area are listed in the table below.
