CHARTER REPORT _ ROCKHOPPER

PROGRAMME: FBA 1/2 SCALLOPS

STAFF: P J Dare D Key

LOCATION! Veryan Bay & Falmouth Bay, S Cornwall

DATES: 10-15 October 1986

AIMS: To complete the 4 days' work of the May charter which were lost due to bad weather.

- To survey, by CCTV and 35mm cameras, and by dredges, the Veryan Bay scallop ground previously surveyed by MAFF divers in 1983-85.
- 2. To test the epibenthic sledge for sampling surface substrates and searching for small scallops (Falmouth Bay and Veryan Bay).
- To obtain hydroid samples for scallop settlement studies (Falmouth Bay and Veryan Bay).
- 4. To repeat other selected 1983-85 dredge stations in Veryan Bay, as time permits.

NARRATIVE:

Staff travelled by road to Portscatho on 10 October and rendezvoused with Mr Curtis, skipper-owner of the 32ft scalloper ROCKHOPPER. The next 2 days were devoted to aims 1 & 2; the last 2 days to operating the cameras sledge and a beam trawl (for hydroid sampling) on a scallop ground off Falmouth. Staff returned to Lowestoft on 15 October.

RESULTS:

The cameras sledge was deployed twice in Veryan Bay and twice in Falmouth Bay (3 miles E of Zone Point, 1 mile SE of The Bizzies). The diver ground and other areas in Veryan Bay appeared to be virtually devoid of scallops – none were seen by CCTV and only 4 caught in 2 \times 20 min tows with 3 dredges. The epibenthic sledge collected various clam juveniles but no scallops. By contrast, the scalloping ground near The Bizzies was productive – a number of medium-large scallops were observed swimming, as were queenies, and some hydroids were taken in the 2m beam trawl.

A total of 3 video tapes was recorded, and about 700 colour frames exposed using the Olympus head-line trawl camera. The Nikon camera was damaged irretrievably by sea-water when the Ikelite plastic case leaked badly on its first 'dive' of the trip (and after testing <u>in situ</u>).
